



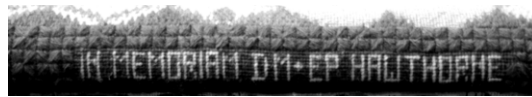
NEW ALTAR KNEELER

During the 2011 Easter Day service The Rector dedicated the new kneeler to the memory of Dinnie and Edward Hawthorne.

The project was the original concept of, and designed by, Jenny Hardwick. The needle-work was done by Jenny with assistance from Ann Trew, Jenny Stacey and Delia Fletcher and was mounted on its support by Colin Mantripp. The project was funded from a very generous donation by the Hawthorne Family and also by gifts from members of the congregation.

Some Facts

The kneeler is 330cm long by 36cm wide. Nine colours of wool were used. Approximately 260 hours of needlework were required over a period of 14 months. The top and the sides are in Florentine and Milanese stitching styles respectively.



The Photograph

The photograph of the kneeler is a composite of eight separate shots combined in *Photoshop* to give a single picture of a massive 106 Mb. The shots were taken in daylight without any flash. The set up is shown above. After each shot the kneeler was moved sideways with the camera left untouched. To avoid distortions only the middle 50% of each of the 8 shots was used in the composite.
